ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, the Court is concerned with the outbreak of COVID-19 in detention and correctional facilities and anticipates numerous motions for compassionate release for pretrial and presentence detainees based upon the pandemic virus, therefore, effective 12:00 A.M. on April 22, 2020, it is hereby

ORDERED that the Office of the Territorial Public Defender is hereby appointed to represent any and all Defendants who are without counsel, or whose counsel is unavailable or unable to be contacted, for the sole purpose of Motions for Compassionate Release. It is further

ORDERED that the Office of the Territorial Public Defender in consultation with the defendant shall determine if it is appropriate to represent the defendant on any motions for pretrial release. It is further

ORDERED that the Office of the Territorial Public Defender shall notify the Clerk of the Court immediately in the event there is a conflict of interest. It is further

ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court shall immediately notify the Office of the Territorial Public Defender of all pending or new pro se motions seeking compassionate pretrial release, so that the Office of the Territorial Public Defender can assume representation of the aforementioned motions in a timely manner. It is further

ORDERED that the Office of the Territorial Public Defender and the Department of Justice shall promptly confer about the defendant's release and when possible stipulate to the release of the Defendant and the conditions. It is further

ORDERED that if there is no stipulation for release, the Office of the Territorial Public Defender shall promptly notify the Court and a hearing on the motion for release may be scheduled unless the judicial officer decides the motion on the written filings.
